Background

- Limited skilled workforce that makes it difficult for startups to recruit and retain the talent they need to grow their business.

INTRODUCTION

The National Innovation and Startup Policy (NISP) Cell and Institutes Innovation Cell (IIC) of Government Degree College for women, Pulwama has organized a two-day National Workshop on "Scope of Technology Driven Entrepreneurship Development in Jammu and Kashmir" in collaboration with GIAN, CSIR-IIIM Field Station, Pulwama, and IEC-IDP (SKUAST-K). The workshop was held on 27th and 28th of March, 2023 and aimed to provide a platform for students, aspiring entrepreneurs, and policymakers to discuss and explore the potential of technology-driven entrepreneurship in Jammu and Kashmir.

DAY 1: 27th MARCH 2023

The first day of the workshop began with an inaugural ceremony by the Principal of the college Prof. (Dr.) Yasmeen Farooq Khan, where the organizers welcomed the guests and participants. The welcome address was delivered by the Principal of the college, Prof. (Dr.) Yasmeen Farooq Khan highlighting the need for promoting entrepreneurship in Jammu and Kashmir and the role of technology in its development followed by presenting the Mementos to the Guest speakers.

Dr. Shahid Rasool Sr. Scientist, CSIR-IIIM, Jammu

Prof. Iram Allaie, Assistant Professor in the Department of English, GWC, Pulwama introduced the first speaker of the session, Dr. Shahid Rasool, Sr. Scientist, CSIR-IIIM, Field station, Bonera, Pulwama. Dr. Rasool highlighted the current status of essential oils and the scope of agri-tech business in J&K particularly the production and value-chain management of medicinal and aromatic plants (MAPs) for securing livelihoods and entrepreneurship developments. He also highlighted the various CSIR-IIIM initiatives for the promotion of medicinal and aromatic plants in the Jammu & Kashmir particularly National Aroma Mission. Dr. Rasool also highlighted how the local people of Jammu & Kashmir developed branded products using MAPs as ingredients to earn their better livelihood, besides he mentioned few brands of J&K viz., *Zayaan Organics, JK Aroma, Shirin Aromatics, Kashmel, and Poshey*. Lastly, Dr. Rasool addressed the challenges faced by this sector and the way forward like policy interventions, incentives from the Govt., financial services, industry-academia partnership, incubation and trade alignment.


