### **NAAC RE\_ACCREDITATION PROCESS**

**Dated 13<sup>th</sup> MAY, 2022**

The IQAC, Govt. Degree College for Women Pulwama organized a one day training programme for the faculty members of the college titled “NAAC Re-Accreditation Process” on 13<sup>th</sup> May 2022 in the Conference Hall of the College in which IQAC members of the Govt. Degree College Pulwama were invited for a special lecture on NAAC Re-Accreditation Process. The programme started at 11:00 am in the morning with the formal welcome address by Prof. Umer Jan Sofi Convener, Research Committee, to the invited guests, participants and organizers. The programme was followed by the presentations of four IQAC members of Govt. Degree College Pulwama who interacted with the faculty members about improvement to be made in the grading of the college. The program was divided into two sessions- the morning session and afternoon session. In the morning session there were two presentations. The first resource person, Dr. Mohammad Amin Mir, Coordinator IQAC talked about the quantitative matrices of Criterion 1 and Criterion 2 of NAAC manual. He said that the metrics of SSR assesses the institution on intensive factors, not extensive ones. The Criterion 1 covers 58 aspects which include programmes offered by the institution, students enrolment, students with reserved categories, infrastructure of the college, ICT enabled classrooms, number of teachers with PhD and published papers, number of teachers being a part of BoS/Academic Council, members for designing of Syllabus and Curriculum, collection, analysis and action taken on feedback received from all the five stakeholders. The Criterion 2 covers aspects like Mentorship, Student-Teacher Ratio, Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS), Attainment of Programme Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) etc.

Dr Parvaiz Ahmad, IQAC member of Govt. Degree College Pulwama, demonstrated the qualitative metrics of NAAC manual. He appreciated the faculty members for their passion towards work. He added that sensitization is already done among the faculty members and they are passionate to work. Dr. Parvaiz Ahmad spoke at length about Programme Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (CO's) and about the sampling of POs and CO's. He also spoke about the qualitative part of Criterion 1 i.e Planning and Implementation which was discussed under three sub heads-Curriculum, Examination, and Time table.

The second session started at 2.30 pm with a presentation by an IQAC member of Govt. Degree College Pulwama, Dr Tanveer Ahmad. He spoke about the qualitative part of Criterion 2 which talks about ICT enabled classrooms and also impressed upon some important points in his presentation related to setting of question papers for assessment which should cater to the needs of all the learners, keeping a record of all the grievances and remedial classes given to students.

The last resource person to speak on the topic was Prof. M Showkat Ali, IQAC member Govt. Degree College Pulwama. At the outset, he appreciated the college for the infrastructural development. He talked about Criterion 5 of the NAAC manual. He talked about various aspects like Student Support and Progression, Scholarships, Maintaining a record of Alumna of the College, Forming of an Alumna Association. He ended his presentation on the point that there should be coordination between faculty members and they should keep aside the differences and agree even in their disagreements. He believed that the college will be able to improve the NAAC grade owing to the dedication and passion of the faculty members. The programme ended at 4 pm with a vote of thanks presented by Dr Satinder Singh, HOD Economics. The Principal of the college, Prof. Mushtaq Ahmad Lone, presented certificates to the resource persons. Prof. Zahoor Ahmad Thoker, HoD Education moderated both the sessions. The rapporteur for the program was Prof. Heena Fayaz, Department of English. 38 participants benefited from the programme.
